Absentee Voting

If voting in person is difficult for you, Minnesota has a process for voters to "Vote early by Mail." Voters can apply to vote by mail or individuals can vote early in person. Voters will need to provide their MN issued driver's license or MN issued photo ID card or the last four digits of their social security number.

To vote early in person, simply go to your local election office in your county, city or town during regular office hours. Usually this is located in the Office of the City Clerk. The first day to vote in person is Friday, September 23 for the general election. The last day to vote in person is Monday, November 7.

To apply for an absentee ballot, voters may apply online, may apply by email or fax, or may phone the local election office. Applications will be sent to you. Complete the ballot and return it to the election office on or before Election Day by mail, package delivery or by dropping it off. You may apply for a ballot any time of the year.

Eye on the Pension TRA Challenge for New Fiscal Year

Best efforts to get a course correction for the TRA pension fund fell short in the past legislative cycle. Responding to information gleaned from our last **experience study which showed government retirees' have exceptionally long** lives (Minnesota has the highest life expectancy in the continental U.S.)– 81.1 years which will cost up to \$1.4 billion more than planned, the TRA Board spent the better part of the year studying possible measures to realign TRA to full funding.

All the stakeholders had an opportunity to participate and make suggestions as the TRA Board crafted our legislative proposal; keeping in mind our objective of shared sacrifice, sustainability, and eventual full funding.

TRA proposed and presented a package of various solutions to offset \$1 billion in the new projected costs. The result; a greatly pared-down one-year sustainability measure from the legislature that failed to address the long-term needs of the TRA and other pension funds, was vetoed by Governor Dayton. It included a measure to reduce the investment assumption to 8% and a 1% COLA reduction for current retirees. The result would have been \$81 million in savings.

While TRA Executive Director Laurie Fiori Hacking indicated waiting until next year is manageable, she cautioned that the financial problems should be addressed before they become extremely costly to solve.

The TRA Board will be reviewing and reworking the data to develop approaches to help steer the pension fund to course correction, as is ongoing and needed in any managed fund. New proposals, based upon current information, will be presented to the legislature in 2017. Stakeholders will again be involved in the process. The concept of shared sacrifice will remain at the core of the TRA **Board's future proposals**.



It is our hope that the proposal will be discussed as part of the state budget early in the legislative session so pensions **can be addressed in a thoughtful way. This is never a "one and done" solution but thoughtful course correction as the** need arises. Keep yourself informed on pension issues.

- All Education Minnesota Retired members will receive a ballot and should vote for Board and Delegate positions. Members should only vote for the Congressional Director Candidates for their District.

The Legislative Commission on Pensions Retirement is a bipartisan commission with members from both Legislative houses. It is currently chaired by Rep. Tim O'Driscoll, a Republican House member. After elections in November, the chair will pass to the Senate side and whichever party is in the majority of the Senate. The Chair of this commission has a great deal of influence over recommendations to the Legislature.

With all Minnesota House and Senator seats up for election this fall, we do not know who will be serving on the LCPR next session. Who is elected will make a difference. If you want to make a difference,

- Vote
- Learn how TRA compares with public pensions in other states
- Talk to candidates about public pensions

We need representatives who understand the value of defined-benefit pensions, the responsibility of the state to keep its promises, and that Minnesota public pensions are generally in very good condition because of a history of responsible management. While adjustments are necessary, we are not in the kind of pension crises like some states, who have a history of poor management and lack of contributions. We need representatives who understand that Minnesota public employees have contributed significantly to their pension funds and that more than 70 percent of benefits are paid from returns on investments.

Pledge to yourself that you will do one volunteer activity for a candidate who will advocate for the sustainability of defined-benefit public pensions. Imagine the impact of every member doing this.
