#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

Now that the Minnesota Legislature is in session, educators need to keep an eye on what is being proposed under the guise of reform. As retirees, we should also accept our share of responsibility to keep track of proposed legislation. The new Speaker of the House, Kurt Daudt, set out the Republicans first five ideas in the form of five bills (Star Tribune, Thursday, January 8).

- 1. Grow additional better-paying jobs for all
- 2. Refocus transportation dollars on roads and bridges
- 3. Make sure every child receives a world-class education
- 4. Protect aging adults quality of life
- 5. Ensure fair access and affordability in health care

This is in sharp contrast to what Republicans in Congress have proposed in the past:

- Reduce Social Security to handicapped and elderly
- Repeal the Affordable Care Act
- They won't increase the Federal minimum wage
- They won't fully fund Special Education

As Retirees we need to protect our pensions at the state level and Social Security at the national level. As grandparents or great grandparents we have to support increased funding for public education by staying in contact with our Legislators and members of Congress. Make sure they know what we support or oppose. As a voter you will receive propaganda from sources you may or may not agree with.

Recently, on two separate occasions, I received flyers from "Minnesota Action Network", a right wing group that has nothing in their materials that I agree with. Both of the flyers were attacks on Senator Jim Carlson, who happens to be my State Senator. While they do have the right to free speech, there are many such groups that come up with names that appear innocuous. Don't let them fool you.

The Education Minnesota Retired Fall Breakfast was held on Thursday, October 16 at the Science Museum of Minnesota in St. Paul. The agenda included a full breakfast, excellent guest speakers and the chance to network with Education Minnesota Retired colleagues. The speakers included:

- State Auditor Rebecca Otto, who was very specific in stating that MN is <u>NOT</u> the next Detroit.
  Otto outlined the state of Minnesota's pensions and provided insight into the new Government Accounting Standards Board (GASB) rules that take effect this year. FACT: pensions provide retirement security in our communities-not poverty.
- Education Minnesota Secretary-Treasurer Rodney Rowe stressed elections, elections, elections. He went on to discuss the task force created to study continuous membership, how they are progressing and some of the challenges they are overcoming as they work to bring a resolution proposing continuous membership to the floor at a future Representative Convention.
- Dan Mikel spoke about the restoration of the Capitol building in St. Paul. He went on to share a YouTube video featuring our own Walt Munsterman
- Rick Winters wrapped up the morning with an update on his project, funded by AFT that puts retired educators to work to help in elections. The program has been a great success thanks to the effort of our Education Minnesota Retired colleagues.

### INVESTMENT ASSUMPTION RATE OF TRA

First, the good news: The State Board of Investment returns for the most recent fiscal year, ending June 30, 2014, yielded 18.6%. If you look at thirty year returns the yield is 10.3%. The five-year returns are 14.5%. The actuarial assumption for earnings (defined in pension law) is currently 8% and is returning to 8.5% in 2016.

The funding ratios for the three state systems are: MSRS at 91%; PERA at 81% and TRA at 83%. TRA is finally finished with the negative years that we carried in our five year smoothing so, at least for the current cycle, those carried losses are gone. Our work in 2010, along with our shared sacrifice approach coupled with a more rosy investment scenario, has the funding for TRA on the right track.

Now the bad news. Why is this an important issue for retirees and why is there discussion among some legislators to alter the actuarial assumption rate for TRA? When you move the rate downward, the money has to be made up somewhere else; either through higher contribution rates for active teachers, or lower COLA's for current retirees. The effect of dropping the assumption rate reduces TRA's funding ratio to 78%. A higher COLA kicks in when TRA's funding ratio rises above 90% for two consecutive years, that goal becomes more distant for current retirees.

Look for TRA's Experience Study on Public Pensions that will be released in May 2015. This outlines the health of Minnesota pension systems. The assumption rate going forward with be discussed and debated. You have a stake in the outcome so stay tuned and become involved in the process.
